PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Cabrini College's **Alyssa Brady** (Sr, Guard, Allentown, PA/Allentown Central Catholic) was named the Colonial States Athletic Conference women's basketball player of the week for the week ending January 31st. Brady averaged a double-double with 19.0 points and 10.0 rebounds per game in three victories. Brady shot 59.5 percent from the floor overall. She totaled 15 points and 10 boards in a 65-54 win against Montclair State University Jan. 26. Brady scored 20 points and grabbed eight boards in a 77-53 win against Cedar Crest College Jan. 28. She tallied 22 points and 12 boards in a 68-64 win at Centenary College Jan. 30.

HONOR ROLL

Neumann University's **Brittany Whetts** (Sr, Forward, Philadelphia, PA/Bartram) was named to the Colonial States Athletic Conference honor roll for women's basketball for the week ending January 31st. **Whetts** was named ECAC South player of the week for the second consecutive week on 1/26/10 and third time this season. She was honored on 1/26/10 at the University of the Sciences in Philadelphia for being selected as one of the "Sam Cozen" small college/university player's of the year for men's and women's basketball for 2009-10 season. In addition, Brittany became the all time leading scorer at Neumann University scoring 33 points against Cedar Crest College on 1/30/10 surpassing the previous record of 1,608 held by Kaleena Simmons. Brittany currently has 1,633 points in her career. Brittany led the Knights to a 3-0 record for the week and a 2-0 CSAC conference record for the week.

Jackie Dooley (Sr, Forward, Cheltenham, PA/Cheltenham) of Gwynedd-Mercy College was named to the Colonial States Athletic Conference honor roll for women's basketball for the week ending January 31st. Dooley had 20-plus points in two of three games this week, leading her team to a 3-0 mark. On Monday at Keystone, she notched her second double-double of the season (13 points/12 rebounds). On Thursday, she set a career-high with 24 points on 9-of-10 shooting in the win over Rosemont. The senior forward tied her personal best with 24 points in Saturday's win over Marywood as she was a perfect 16-for-16 from the free-throw line.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Centenary College's **Ryan Kearney** (Sr. Forward, North Arlington NJ/Queen of Peace) was named the Colonial States Athletic Conference men's basketball player of the week for the week ending January 31st. Kearney averaged a double-double in a 2-0 week with 25.5 points, 10.5 rebounds, 3 steals, and two blocks per game for the week. The forward included a 27 point, 11 rebound and five steal performance in a win against Marywood University and a 24 point, 10 rebound, three block performance against previously unbeaten Cabrini College. Kearney also provided stellar defense in that game, holding his man to just 30% shooting.

HONOR ROLL

Gwynedd-Mercy's **Jon Hogga** (Jr. Forward, Phoenixville, PA/Phoenixville) was named to the Colonial States Athletic Conference honor roll for the men's basketball for the week ending January 31st. Hogga averaged 19 points, 9 rebounds, and 4 assists while shooting over 50% from the floor in a 2-1 CSAC week. The junior started the week off in a game at Keystone, totaling 16 points, 9 boards, 5 assists, 2 steals, and 2 blocks. Later in the week during the win over Rosemont, Hogga also scored 16 points with 7 rebounds, 5 assists. The forward closed the week tying his season high with 26 points on 11-of-19 shooting with 12 rebounds and 3 assists in the win over Marywood University.
