WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Marywood University's **Mariah Schaeffer** (So., Guard, Bainbridge, NY/Bainbridge-Guilford) was named the Colonial States Athletic Conference Player of the Week for Women's basketball for the week ending December 6th. Schaeffer scored a game-high 25 points in Marywood's 80-66 win over Immaculata on Monday. The sophomore guard scored team-highs of 14 points and 8 rebounds in the win over Keystone on Saturday as the Pacers improved to 6-0 on the season (2-0 CSAC).

HONOR ROLL

Centenary College's **Marissa DiStasio** (Jr., Forward, Norwich, CT/Norwich Free Academy) was named to the Colonial States Athletic Conference honor roll for women's basketball for the week ending December 6th. She recorded her second double-double of the season with 15 points and a career-high matching 21 rebounds in Centenary's 90-69 come-from-behind win over Immaculata. DiStasio shot five-of-11 from the floor, including one-of-one from three-point range, in the win. The junior forward also hit four of her six free throws and recorded three steals.

Gwynedd-Mercy College's **Jackie Dooley** (Sr., Forward, Cheltenham, PA/Cheltenham) was named to the Colonial States Athletic Conference honor roll for women's basketball for the week ending December 6th. Dooley averaged 12 points and 6.5 rebounds while shooting 58% in two CSAC wins last week. In a win at Baptist Bible, she totaled 17 points and 7 rebounds. Against Philadelphia Biblical the senior forward registered 7 points and 6 rebounds.

Cabrini College's **Deana DiAmico** (Sr., Guard, Wilmington, DE/Ursuline Academy) was named to the Colonial States Athletic Conference honor roll for women's basketball for the week ending December 6th. The senior point guard averaged 14.5 points and shot 68.8 percent from the floor overall in two CSAC wins for Cabrini. She totaled 14 points on 5-for-6 shooting versus Philadelphia Biblical. DiAmico posted 15 points on 6-for-10 shooting at Baptist Bible. She shot 75.0 percent from the 3-point line in two games.

MEN'S BASKETBALL

PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Kenneth Hardnett (Soph., Forward, Plant City, Florida/Plant City) of the Keystone Giants, was named the Colonial States Athletic Conference's Player of the Week for the week ending December 6th. Hardnett averaged 16.3 points and 14.0 rebounds for the week. He recorded three double-doubles during the week in which the team went 3-0 in conference play. The sophomore had a team high 20 points against Rosemont College and a team high in rebounds in all three games; 14 verse Rosemont, 17 verse Philadelphia Biblical and 11 verse Marywood University. Hardnett also had a team season high with six steals against Philadelphia Biblical.

HONOR ROLL

Gwynedd-Mercy's **Jon Hogga** (Junior, Forward, Phoenixville, PA/Phoenixville) was named to the Colonial States Athletic Conference's honor roll for the week ending December 6th. Hogga averaged 20.5 points, 10.5 rebounds, 2.5 assists, and 3.5 steals per game on the week. Hogga shot over 65% from the floor in two CSAC wins during the week. The junior started off the week with a 21-point, 11 rebound in a win at Baptist Bible. Hogga then followed that up with 20 points, 10 boards, four assists, and three steals in a win at Philadelphia Biblical.

Na'Sheed Linton (Senior, Point Guard, Trenton, NJ/Solebury Prep) from Neumann University was named to the Colonial States Athletic Conference's honor roll for the week ending December 6th. Linton led the Knights to a 2-1 record for the week with two conference wins. To start the week at home against Elizabethtown, Linton had 10 points and 5 assist in the loss. In a win at Rosemont the senior went a perfect 6-6 from the field for 13 points while dishing out 19 assists in 28 minutes of action. To end the week, Linton went for 24 points on 11-16 shooting while giving out 11 assists for the 91-83 win. Linton played 106 of a possible 120 minutes and committed only 4 turnovers helping the Knights to a 2-1 week.
