WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Neumann University's **Brittany Whetts** (Sr., Guard, Philadelphia, PA/Bartram) was named the Colonial States Athletic Conference player of the week for the week ending January 17, 2010. Whetts had two double-doubles in three CSAC contests this week to lead Neumann to a 3-0 week in conference action. She netted at least 21 points in all three games against Keystone College, Rosemont College and Centenary College. The senior leads the team in points (18.0) and rebounds (10.7) per game.

HONOR ROLL

Jen Vasta (So., Guard, Boonton, NJ/Boonton) of Centenary College was named to the Colonial States Athletic Conference honor roll for women's basketball for the week ending January 17, 2010. Vasta led Centenary to a 2-1 record in three CSAC games by averaging 21.7 points, 4.7 assists, 3.7 rebounds and 3.3 steals per game. She posted a .600 field goal percentage in the three contests (27-of-45) while shooting 11-of-14 from the free throw line. In Centenary's 92-84 win over Cedar Crest, she finished with 26 points on 12-of-18 shooting, along with six rebounds, five assists, four steals and two blocks. She then posted a game-high 27 points in CC's 93-91 loss to Neumann, shooting 11-of-16 from the floor while recording four assists, four steals and two rebounds.

Gwynedd-Mercy College's **Kristy McGrath** (Jr., Forward, West Chester, PA/Bishop Shanahan) was named to the Colonial States Athletic Conference honor roll for women's basketball for the week ending January 17, 2010. McGrath made her first career start a memorable one, scoring a career-high 23 points, and added 8 rebounds and 3 assists in a 70-65 road win at Cabrini on Monday. She shot 7-13 from the floor including a 2-3 stint from downtown and a 7-of-10 spot at the line.

MEN'S BASKETBALL

PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Cabrini College's **Cory Lemons** (Fr., Guard, Wilmington DE/Glasgow) was named the Colonial States Athletic Conference Player of the Week for the week ending January 17th. The freshman averaged 24.7 points and shot 55.8 percent from the floor in three CSAC victories. Lemons scored 24 points on 9-for-14 shooting overall and dished out 10 assists for his first career double-double in an 83-68 win against Gwynedd-Mercy College. Lemons tallied a career-high 34 points on 14-for-22 shooting and grabbed seven rebounds in a 100-98 victory against Keystone College. He scored another 26 points in a 74-63 win versus Rosemont College.

HONOR ROLL

Immaculata University's **John Boyd** (Soph., Guard, Trappe PA/Perkiomen Valley) was named to the Colonial States Athletic Conference Honor Roll for the week ending January 17th. Boyd helped Immaculata go 2-0 in conference play with victories against Philadelphia Biblical and Marywood averaging 18.5 points and 6.0 rebounds. In the win over Marywood, Boyd was 10-for-14 from the field, including 4 of 6 behind the arc, to lead the Mighty Macs with 26 points. The sophomore also had 11 points and a team-leading seven rebounds versus Philadelphia Biblical University.

Malcom Boone (Soph., Forward, Sugar Loaf, NY/ Warwick) of Keystone College was named to the Colonial States Athletic Conference Honor Roll for the week ending January 17th. Boone helped lead the Giants to a 2-1 week with wins at Neumann University and Lancaster Bible College and a 2-point loss at Cabrini College. Against Neumann the forward netted a career high 25 points on 7-9 shooting from the field and an 11-12 effort from the line. He also added 7 boards and a pair of steal. In a 100-98 loss to Cabrini he tied his career high with his second 25 point (9-12 from the floor) game in two games, in addition to 7 rebounds and 3 blocks. Boone capped the week off with an 18-point and 7 rebound game at Lancaster Bible where he recorded a career high 7 steals in the game with 2 blocks and 2 assists.

Gwynedd-Mercy College's **Jon Hogga** (Jr., Forward, Phoenixville PA/ Phoenixville) was named to the Colonial States Athletic Conference Honor Roll for the week ending January 17th. Hogga averaged 14.7 points and 11 rebounds in a 2-1 CSAC week. In the game at Cabrini, Hogga racked up 13 points and a career-best 18 boards. Late in the week the junior was one rebound shy of a double-double, finishing with 17 points, 9 rebounds, 3 steals and 2 assists in a win over Philadelphia Biblical University. He closed the week with 14 points, 6 rebounds, 3 assists, and 2 steals in a road win at Marywood University.
